You know the old saying, "the grass seems greener on the other side of the fence," but we all know that it rarely is. The same holds true when it comes to replacing your existing Knights of Columbus life insurance with coverage offered by another company. Perceptions are deceiving. A move to the "greener" grass on the other side of the fence might seem like a good one, but it can leave you with less green in your wallet — in some cases, a lot less.

That's why it pays to remember another old adage, "Read the fine print."

There are many reasons to keep your existing coverage in force, whether that coverage is with the Knights of Columbus or with another company. First, all life insurance contracts contain a *contestability period*, which allows the insurer to contest claims made for a period — typically two years — after the contract is issued. Chances are this is no longer an issue with your current coverage. Second, it's unlikely that you can obtain the same amount of coverage, for the same premium, that you were able to obtain with your existing contract. The two factors that determine how much you'll need to pay for life insurance coverage are age and health. Certainly, you're older now than you were when you took out your current coverage. There's no way around that. And you have to ask yourself, has your health changed during that time? Is your blood pressure the same? Your cholesterol? Have you gained weight? All these factors can affect the amount of coverage you'll get for your premium dollar. If someone encourages you to replace — or worse, drop — your existing coverage, please call me. I'll show you how your existing coverage is working for you and why replacement is rarely in your best interest.

Do Not Be Afraid

Hello, my Brother Knights!

I want to share a story about cancer - the struggles of the initial diagnosis; the treatments; the hopes when it was first diagnosed and the future.

My friend at the time of his diagnosis was 51 years old. He is married, has four children and a beautiful wife. His life as a physician was at its apogee, he was hitting on all eight cylinders after 25 years in medical "practice"; he insists that he was "doing medicine" at this point in his career, "What doctor at this point in his career is practicing?"

He spoke with his primary MD for a pain he was having in his lower abdomen, requesting a CT of the abdomen. This was done in early November, 2004. He did not have any symptoms, appetite was good, weight stable. My friend was a vigorous athlete, playing racquetball, hitting the weight machines and bicycling frequently.

He finds out there is a tumor in his pancreas, about 4 centimeters in diameter and it's cancerous. Damn. It's a fairly rare cancer, called "pancreatic neuroendocrine tumor", PNET.

My friend is incredulous, wondering how such a misfortune could have befallen him. He travels to his church; he's a Catholic. He goes into the Blessed Sacrament Chapel and he's on his hands and knees, begging God to grant him more time, to help him fight this tough battle ahead. He's very frightened, yet he believes that God has a plan, that he must make the most of his predicament. He doesn't realize it yet, but he will come to realize that this painful moment will be a positive turning point in his life.

Next issue – tests and surgery await my friend. God bless!
