He is home, in good spirits, and says, 'Coming along slowly, so far so good. I have to wear a brace for 3 months and cannot bend or twist and can only lift 5 pounds. Hopefully I will be cleared by the first week in July."

Brother Jim Dawson is presently in the Healthcare and Wellness Center. He is being treated as an assisted living patient. The address is 920 W. La Veta Ave., Orange CA. 92868. The phone is 714-633-3568. He is still on dialysis, walks a little, gets around in a wheel chair. Says thanks to all the Knights for prays. You might drop him a card. The Knights of our Council are now looking into some type of assisted living for him as he is moving from the present center.

Brother Ron Novello asks, "Please pray for my sister Linda, who suffered a brain hemorrhage and a pulmonary embolism in her lung. Thanks to all the prayers, she

is responding very well and is regaining her health. Her vision and mobility is still a challenge but "God is good, all the time!"



Knight of Columbus Support to VBS

On Thursday, June 25 a number of our Knights provided assistance to the Vacation Bible Study Family Night event in and in front of Glynn Hall. We helped put drinks on ice, set up a few tables, put up pop up tents for added shade, plated food, carried plated food to serving tables, emptied trash bags as they became full, carted off full trash bags to the dumpsters, cleaned the food plating class room and generally were available to help as needed.

The event provided food, drink, dessert, prayer, and songs to 500 people. It was a fantastic success. Three of our Lady Knights were instrumental in putting this event on. They were: Tina Zlaket, Sheila Teevans, and Denice Perales. Actually it was a week long event and completed an opportunity for the children to rally to common themes.

Following is a portion of an email sent to me from Sheila Teevans on Monday of last week.

"At the end of the day today, we introduced Operation Kid-to-Kid. Every year, San Antonio VBS adopts a service project. We use this project to teach our children about the importance of sharing our abundance with others. We also teach them that even as children, they have the power to make significant contributions in the world. And, even though we are each one person who can only do a little bit, when we all do a little bit together, it can add up to something big.

With our theme of "Everest – Conquering Challenges with God's Mighty Power", we've come up with a unique way for our children and families to serve this year. We are partnering with the Knights of Columbus and the American Wheelchair Mission to provide wheelchairs to people in need. Limited mobility is a challenge ~ and with our own mighty power, we can help someone conquer that challenge.

We ask our campers and volunteers to donate spare change and bills throughout our VBS week. With so many people involved in our VBS, your donations will add up quickly. A wheelchair costs \$150. How many can we buy?

We will have a donation jar at the table just outside of the parish hall for the rest of the week. Each day, we will tally our proceeds, report on our progress, and let the kids know how many wheelchairs we've purchased. We will give a grand total on Friday. With your help, our campers will help someone Conquer a Challenge with their own Mighty Power.

Thank you for supporting our Everest Service Project!"

I am told that each day the children were told where the collected tally stood. Their energy and enthusiasm grew daily. The children really got into it and brought their change each day to put into the jar for that purpose. When I left the event on Thursday

evening, I was told that they had collected enough for 7 wheelchairs. That is \$1,050. Amazing.

The VBS program went from Monday to Friday. Today, July 1, I received an email from Sheila Teevans stating that on Friday they collected more coins and their final total for the week was \$1,650. Incredible!!! This will help the Knights provide 11 wheelchairs to the needy.



3rd Degree


