Please keep the following Knights and their families in your thoughts and prayers. Please email or call me for any updates.

With sadness we have to acknowledge that Brother Todd Kridle has passed away. At San Antonio Church-Viewing, Rosary & Eulogies was held on Sunday, 8/16 @ 6:30-8:30 pm-with the Rosary prayer at 7pm. At San Antonio Church-Funeral Mass was held at 10am on Monday 8/17, followed by Gravesite Committal Service (Holy Sepulcher in Orange), followed by reception back at San Antonio Church. Flowers were sent to the family by the Knights.

Brother Jeff Dennison says, "It saddens me to tell you that my mom, Emma Cruz Dennison, has been diagnosed with breast cancer. The nurse she spoke to on the phone seemed optimistic that they may have caught it early enough, however, we really won't know many details (what stage, etc.) until she meets with the surgeon in two weeks and we can discuss our options from there. If you can pass this message on and tell our brother Knights who will pray for her healing, comfort, strength and recovery I would greatly appreciate it."

Brother PGK Maurice McCaughin had an operation for bladder cancer Friday, July 24. He says, "I am doing great Thanks for all of the prayers."

Brother Kevin Garza was hit by a vehicle on his Harley Davidson last month. He was hospitalized for a few days with injuries to spinal cord, chest, lungs, neck right leg severed Achilles, knee, etc. "I love all my brothers and their families, you all have been the best family a man could ever have.

I'm not ever going to be 100% but it's better than DEATH! Thank God and my faith and the faith and prayers of my fellow K of C brethren. I don't believe I'd be here without anyone of those in my life and again I thank you.

I am back at work but only taking an appointment a day. Slow for now but let everyone know that I'm back if they need me. Take care and God bless!"

Brother Don Davis is still recovering from back surgery on 4-13-15 as the result of a fall. He had 2 rods installed to support his spinal column. He is home, in good spirits, and says, "Coming along slowly, so far so good. I have to wear a brace for 3 months and cannot bend or twist and can only lift 5 pounds. If all goes well I will be cleared for full activities on Sept 30. I can do many non high activities now. Thank everyone for their prayers."

Brother Ron Novello asks, "Please pray for my sister Linda, who suffered a brain hemorrhage and a pulmonary embolism in her lung. She has progressed as well as can be expected. She has some permanent loss of her right eyesight and has memory issues. She is still weak in her limbs but somewhat improved. Also pray for my brother-in-law Ted Talian who is undergoing radiation for prostate cancer."

Brother Joe Nanci also said, "His wife, Dora, she had a mild HEART ATTACK. The doctor installed a stent in one of her artery. She's home now to recoup. She is

out of Coumadin and start doing therapy; but she gets really tired. But over all she is back on her trail.”

Brother Bob DePaola says, “There is no change regarding my grandson, No complications have so far, he is still waiting for a kidney. They went to Oklahoma City last week. They told him that he could be considered for the transplant list if he has \$7500.00 to cover the sterile room he would need after the transplant. So in other words he will not be considered until then.”

Brother Bob Fiorentino says, “His cousin Bill, who is being treated from lung cancer in our prayers. Cousin Bill entered hospice on 8/17. Prognosis is not good. They may try an experimental new chemo if they think he can tolerate it. My wife, Phyllis is still fighting anemia and deteriorating kidneys.”

Brother Keith Carden has a condition known as of ME/CFS (chronic fatigue syndrome). He says, “I still am incapacitated about 2-5 days a week.” He suggests watching this video. “Forgotten Plaque Theatrical Trailer #1 (2015).”<https://youtu.be/VsQcmKT3zSo> . “I will help get this Documentary about Myalgic Encephalomyelitis, Chronic fatigue syndrome in the theaters this fall.”

Brother Jack Abajian says, “Please continue to Pray for me and my father Michael, and my sister Marie.” He asks for everyone’s continued Prayers.

Brother Tony Witkay’s wife, Marie, needs our prayers. Tony says, “She was having a good week and a half. Then the tremors came back again. They can get so bad, at times, she cannot walk. Please continue to pray for her. The doctor now says it is defiantly Parkinson's. She is taking it a day at a time. Thanks for your prayers.”
