







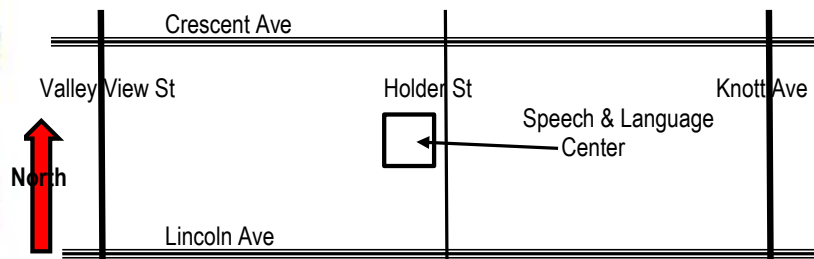

Please keep the following Knights and their families in your thoughts and prayers. Please email or call me for any updates.

Jim Dawson has been admitted to St. Joseph's as of Friday, Mar 13 evening with fluid on his left lung. I spoke to him this afternoon and the doctor had just informed him that they found more fluid on the right lung. Jim is also undergoing regular dialysis treatment. He is not sure how much longer he will be in the hospital. If you have a chance I am sure he would love to hear from you. The hospital main number is 714-771-8000. Wait for the messages to complete and then someone will answer. Ask for Jim's phone. It is 1223. Please keep him in your prayers. Thanks, Jack O'Conner.

I spoke to Jim on Tues, 3-17. They are still draining fluid from his lungs. He doesn't know how long he will be there.

Brother Ron Novello asks, "Please pray for my sister Linda who suffered a brain hemorrhage and a pulmonary embolism in her lung. Linda is a retired Catholic

school teacher. She needs God's grace to heal her and your prayers to our Lord will help her recover.”

Brother Joe Nanci is recovering from skin cancer treatment around his eyes and bridge of his nose. He says, “The surgery is over,(this one)but this condition of dry skin it never ends, it is like an old bucket, you plug one hole and then another burst somewhere also; but presently I'M DOING FINE.”

Brother Tim Fogarty's sister, Mickie Pecoraro, is being treated for liver cancer. Tim says, “She is going through more chemotherapy. Time will tell. She is a pretty tough woman.”

Brother Bob DePaola is recovering from a fall that injured his left knee. He says, “My knee has turned into a weather station; I can now tell when a low pressure system is coming. I have elected to forgo the knee replacement which is one of two choices the doctor gave me. The other is to get a cortisone shot every three months or so. So far I have been able to deal with the pain and not get any more shots. Every now and then the knee pops and I have to stop and straighten it out to go back in line. Other than that I am great.”

Brother Mark Brewster had total knee replacement in early November. He says, “Coming along good, still fighting infection. Taking antibiotics. Started physical therapy the first of Feb.”

Brother Bob Fiorentino says, “Keep his cousin, Bill, who is being treated from lung cancer in our prayers. Still getting chemo treatments, condition same, more evaluation by Dr. in 2 weeks.”

Brother Jim, Schrader says, “My wife, Dorothy, is doing better from her knee replacement.”

Brother Keith Carden says, "I'm about the same battling this disease, CFS. The prayers have worked. Science has found a biomarker. Now research into a cure or at least a treatment can begin. Thank you all. Also what I said on the last one was, a lot of good scientific information has come out these last 6 months. I think my prayers have been answered. More info on this link.

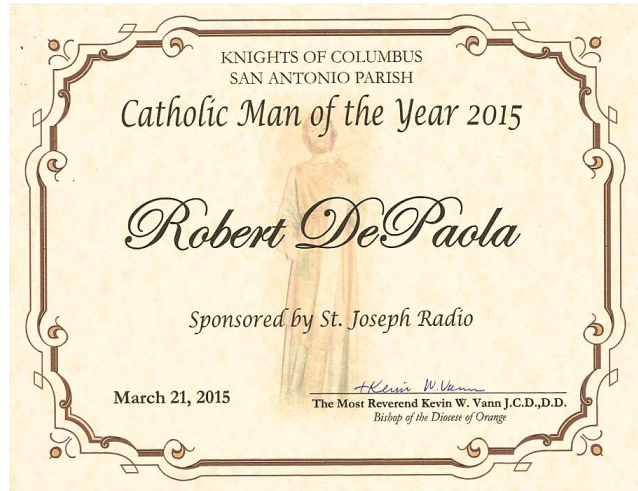
