# **GRAND KNIGHT'S MESSAGE**

My father immigrated to America 100 years ago from a small town

east of Bari, Italy. To him, America was revered as a country that he was honored to become a part of. When he arrived at Ellis Island, he was in his mid-teens, he



was alone, he had a 3<sup>rd</sup> grade education, he did not speak the English language, and he carried a letter stating he should be sent to Tucson, Arizona. When he arrived in Tucson, a cousin of his met him, housed him, fed him, and found him a job with the Pacific Fruit Express Railroad. He was a laborer most of his working career, and eventually he moved to Los Angeles where he met and married my mother and started a family.

Once he arrived in Los Angeles, he immediately got involved with the Catholic community and became a member of the Sons of Italy Society. In time he rose to become the president of his chapter for the Sons of Italy. He also, and he was most proud of this, became one of the primary movers to help find a Catholic Church on North Broadway in downtown Los Angeles, named St. Peter's Italian Church. He was very active in putting on fund raising events and working at the church to help those in need. As a child I watched him do this and was always amazed as to how he, and others, pulled it off.

John and Beatrice Smaldino had three children: Mary, Frank and Ralph. I was named after my Grandfather on my father's side, Francesco. I never met my grandparents on my father's side but learned a lot about them from my father. A major part of my family life was and is from my mother's family. She had 5 sisters and one brother. Every holiday we would have huge family gatherings of

# THE TRUE STORY OF THE CASEY'S "The First USO"

Everyone has heard of the Hollywood Canteen run by the USO. But who remembers who started the whole idea of a place for our soldiers to go. The current USO was founded in 1941 by Mary Ingraham in response to a request from President Franklin D. Roosevelt to provide morale and recreation services to U.S. uniformed military personnel. Where did FDR get the idea of a service organization dedicated to assisting our military? On August 17<sup>th</sup>, 1918 he was the Assistant Secretary of the Navy. During his visit to France he visited a base in Paimboeuf, Western France where he witnessed the work of the K of C and other non-profit organizations at work.



Turning back the clock, prior to Iraq, Afghanistan, Korea, Viet Nam or even WWII. Let's go back to beginning of the USA's involvement in WWI. Early in April, 1917 at the onset of the USA involvement in World War I, Supreme Knight James A. Flaherty proposed to then U.S. President Woodrow Wilson

that the Order establish a soldiers' welfare centers in the U.S. and abroad. In a small office in Washington DC was a small group of dedicated men. The sign on the door read "Committee on War Activities-Knights of Columbus". With no government funding, the Order raised more than \$14 million for this program on its



own, and was allocated another \$30 million from a

national fund drive. The pioneer work was done by half a dozen Knights of Columbus chaplains who reached France in October 1917 and combined with their priestly duties and the activities of Knights of Columbus members. They were given a sum of money and one of them started the first Knights of Columbus club in, St. Nazaire, France, then the principal debarkation port of the American Expeditionary Force (AEF). A survey was made and the first group of K of C members arriving in March 1918. They set up headquarters at 16 Place de la Madeleine, Paris, and from that center the activities of the Knights radiated all over France, through England and Scotland, touching on Ireland and Italy, and following the Army of Occupation into Germany.

#### **Everyone Welcome, Everything Free**



"Everyone Welcome, Everything Free" was the motto of the Knights of Columbus clubhouses which sprung up in Doughboy training camps, in major U.S. cities and wherever a Doughboy could be found. Manned by K of C members who were affectionately known as "Casey's" the clubhouses provided recreation and a few of the amenities of home to any serviceman regardless of race, color or religion. And to Catholic servicemen they provided Chaplains and place to practice their faith. The Knights were one of the youngest volunteer organizations drawn into support to the AEF's.

CLUBS AND HUTS: The establishment of clubs and the building of huts for the recreation of the soldiers was an attempt to give the boys a home away from home. The K of C members proved to be incredibly industrious. From their bases at Toul and St-Menehould they would take supplies to the front. They conveyed commodities along congested roads. They ministered to the men, made their way through the woods to units which had become temporarily cut off from the mess kitchens: they helped with the wounded in the first-aid stations, served hot drinks to the soldiers under fire, acted as stretcher bearers, accompanied and aided the burial details, suffering the same privations and hardships of war as the doughboys.

During their first month the Casey's passed out 37,719 cartons of chocolate; 25,250 cartons of chewing gum; 14,772 baseballs, 2,286 sets of boxing gloves, and 1,687 footballs; 10 million sheets of writing paper and 8 million envelopes. In a time when the health impact of smoking was not understood they also distributed 57 million cigarettes. However poor the hut on the front might be, the soldiers loved it. It was "a poor thing but mine own." Here they could write letters, smoke cigarettes, chew gum or drink coffee. Athletics were a special care of the Knights. Many of the leading figures in boxing such as Joe Jackson, Fireman Jim Flynn, Joe Dempsey and baseball great's such as Joe

### Tinker, Johnny Evers and Frank Chance crossed the

ocean in the service of Knights the and worked the camps. A ballfield and boxing ring were features of many of the Knights of Columbus Clubs. Even segregation though was rampant in the AEF & in other organization, it had no place at the K of C huts. "Everyone welcome".



By the end of the War the Casey's had earned the respect and admiration of many veterans they had served. That admiration led to the largest influx of new Knights ever into the 40-year-old organization at War's end. The Knights work, however, did not end with the War. Following the War the Knights set up employment boards for returning Veterans and later joined with the VFW and American Legion in support of the returned Doughboys. When the K of C war activities officially ended in 1921 the Knights had provided immeasurable support to our Veterans and Universal respect of those they had served

Sometime on the evening of 10/11 September, a fire broke out in Mary's kitchen. It was located on the



north east section of the kitchen. The overhead cover was destroyed and there was some damage to a wall on the kitchen trailer. 3 refrigerators and 1 freezer were also damaged beyond

repair. All the refrigeration units inside continue to



There were no injuries and the cause of the fire is still under investigation. For a few days both gas and electricity were turned off.



As of last Friday, 16 September, the kitchen is back in full operation. The charred beams replaced with new ones the wall has been repaired and painted. If there is good news- it is that the stove was torn

down and completely cleaned. Once the budget is formally approved at the next council meeting, we plan to contribute the full amount of \$2,000 to Mary's kitchen. # MARY'S KITCHEN BURNED, NOT BEATEN

Excerpt from OC Register By Jonathon Winslow September 13, 2016

ORANGE – The kitchen was closed but lunch still served Tuesday as Mary's Kitchen leaders figure out how to repair at least \$150,000 in fire damage to the building, which provides meals to more than 1,000 people each week.

"This is what we do, and we'll be darned if a little fire would stop us," Gloria Suess, president and CEO of Mary's Kitchen, said as guests lined up outside with trays and dined together at nearby tables.

Mary's Kitchen – which provides food, clothes, showers and other services to the homeless – was red-tagged after a fire destroyed a large walk-in freezer full of food and two refrigerators Friday night, taking the kitchen offline.

Electricity and gas have been restored, but there's no estimate as to when the kitchen will be fully functional. Showers may be operational as early as today, staff said. Suess said the hope is insurance will cover most of the repairs.

Capt. Casey Fieldhouse of the Orange Fire Department said the fire started at 6:58 p.m. Friday. The damage was limited to the rear of the building; the cause is under investigation, he said.

With cooking temporarily off the table, volunteers gathered Tuesday to dole out servings of brought-in tuna casserole and bagged lunches while workers toiled in the background to get things back to normal

Mary's Kitchen was founded in 1984 by Mary McAnena, who found her calling after helping a homeless woman in Orange's Hart Park.


