Sergeant Major Slade enlisted in April 1986 and reported to Marine Corps Recruit Depot, Parris Island for recruit training. Upon graduation, he reported to the School of Infantry, Camp Geiger, North Carolina earning the MOS

0311. He then reported to 3rd Battalion, 25th Marines, for duty as an infantryman.

In September 1990 he reenlisted and accepted a lateral move into Supply Administration and was assigned to Marine Aircraft Group 41, Naval Air Station. Dallas, Texas.

SEMPER FIDELIS

Sergeant Major Slade reported to Camp Lejeune, North Carolina in March 1994 where he served with 2d Supply Battalion, MEU Service Support Group 24, and Command Element, 24th Marine Expeditionary Unit. During this assignment he completed two Mediterranean deployments aboard the USS Saipan and USS Guam; participating in Operations Joint Endeavor, Joint Guard and Desert Thunder.

In July 1998 Sergeant Major Slade transferred to Marine Corps Base, Quantico, Virginia and was assigned to Service Company, Headquarters and Service Battalion. During this tour he served as Company Gunnery Sergeant; Section Head, Small Purchase Section and Procurement Chief for Regional Contracting Office, Quantico.

AND SO WE BEGIN



We have all heard the story of how the Knights of Columbus was established. As you can remember, it was in the late-19th century in Connecticut was marked by the growing prevalence of fraternal benefit societies, all with hostility toward the influx of Catholic immigrants, the dangerous working conditions in factories that left many families fatherless. Recognizing a need in his community, Father Michael J. McGivney, who was assistant pastor of St. Mary's Church in New Haven, Conn., gathered a group of men at his parish. On October 2, 1881, he proposed to a group of his parishioners his idea to establish a lay organization, the goal of which would be to prevent Catholic men from entering secret societies whose membership was contradictory to Church teaching, to unite men of Catholic faith and to provide for the families of deceased members.

The Order was intended as a mutual benefit society. These organizations, which combined social aspects and ritual were especially flourishing during the latter third of the nineteenth century, the so-called "Golden Age of Fraternalism." He had to temporarily leave his seminary studies to care for his family when his father died. However, Roman Catholics In the late 19th century were regularly excluded from labor unions, popular fraternal organizations and other organized groups that provided social services and Catholic circulars issued by the Pope prohibited Roman Catholics participating as lodge members within Freemasonry. McGivney wished to provide them an alternative. He also believed that Catholicism and fraternalism were not incompatible and wanted to found a society to encourage men to be proud of their American-Catholic heritage.

McGivney traveled to Boston to examine the Massachusetts Catholic Order of Foresters and to Brooklyn to learn about the recently established Catholic Benevolent League, both of which offered insurance benefits. He found the latter to be lacking the excitement he thought was needed if his organization were to compete with the secret

societies of the day. He expressed an interest in establishing a New Haven Court of the Foresters, but the charter of Massachusetts Foresters prevented them from operating outside their Commonwealth. McGivney's committee of St. Mary's parishioners decided to form a club that was entirely original.




The first meeting of those interested in the Catholic organization known as the Knights of Columbus was held in St. Mary's church Monday evening, and was presided over by James T. Mullen, T. J. Coffee acting as secretary. About sixty were present. A discussion occurred relative to the by-laws of the organization, and it was left to a committee of five to settle and report at the next meeting. Persons will be admitted to membership between eighteen and forty-five years. Another meeting takes place in two weeks.

The name of Columbus was also partially intended as a mild rebuke to Anglo-Saxon Protestant leaders, who upheld the explorer (a Catholic Genovese Italian working for Catholic Spain) as an American hero, yet simultaneously sought to marginalize recent Catholic immigrants. By taking the name of Columbus, the Knights were able to remind the entire country of the Catholic roots of the New World, and to highlight the fact that faithful Catholics could also be good American citizens.

Also in taking Columbus as their patron, they were expressing their belief that not only could Catholics be full members of American society, but were instrumental in its foundation. McGivney had originally conceived of the name "Sons of Columbus", but James T. Mullen,

who would become the first Supreme Knight, successfully suggested that "Knights of Columbus" would better capture the ritualistic nature of the new organization.

We need to understand in the late 1800's it was still thought that the first European was in fact Christopher Columbus. He was recognized as a Catholic and celebrated as the discoverer of America (We now know he was not the first to set foot on what would become the North & South American continent. However he was the first to establish a permanent presents in the newly discovered continent). Thanks to Father McGivney's persistence, the Knights of Columbus elected officers in February 1882 and officially assumed corporate status on March 29, 1882.

In addition to the Order's stated benefits, Catholic men were drawn to the Knights because of its emphasis on serving one's Church, community and family with virtue. Writing in The Columbiad in 1898, a year before he was elected supreme knight, Edward L. Hearn wrote that a Knight should live according to the virtues of loyalty, charity, courtesy

and modesty, as well as "self-denial and careful respect for the feelings of others." The basics of the Knights at this time were Charity and Unity. In 1885 Fraternity was added and in 1900 Patriotism was also added to the Knights' founding.

Along with the addition of "patriotism" to the Knights' principles came the first Fourth Degree exemplification, which took place Feb. 22, 1900, in New York City, with 1,100 Knights participating. A



similar event took place in Boston in May with another 750 candidates taking the patriotic degree. By the beginning of the 20th century, the fledgling Order was growing dramatically. Councils had been chartered throughout the United States and Canada, and international expansion continued to Mexico and the Philippines in 1905, along with Cuba and Panama in 1909.

The Knights also turned their attention to college campuses, and in more ways than one. In 1904, more than 10,000 Knights and their families attended ceremonies at The Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C., in which the Order presented the school with a grant for more than \$55,000. The funds, used to establish a K of C chair of American history, began a long history of support for CUA. In addition, students at the University of Notre Dame in Indiana soon organized their own K of C council. Chartered in 1910, Notre Dame Council 1477 was the Order's first college council, launching a subset of the Knights that today includes councils at 244 schools worldwide.

Mary's kitchen is back in business after the fire. They are serving hot lunches, washing clothes, providing showers and distributing free clothes. Gloria Suess-CEO- informed us that they are working with a few of their sponsors to replace the outside damaged freezer and 2 refrigerators with a larger walk-in freezer and refrigerator. They had to replace a patio cover (which was not covered by insurance) and they will have to bring in additional electric power to support the new freezer and refrigerator.



As you can see in the above photo the damage was extensive. Because the freezer and the refrigerators were outside they were not covered by the insurance company. Their insurance only covered the building and the interior contents.



During our last general meeting our membership approved our 2016 to 2017 budget. Last week our council presented Gloria with a check for \$2,000.00 to help with the fire

damage expenses which were not covered by their insurance company. The damage that occurred outside the building is extensive and that too was not covered so the burden of replacement cost is

She and the doctor from The Mayo Clinic went over all the labs and films. They consensus is they are going to continue treating him with MS meds. If it doesn't work, then no harm in trying. This will be the last effort to save the little vision he has left. This is the last idea any of the doctors have. Please pray for him.

As of the distribution of this newsletter, the surgery was not a success. It seems the Ophthalmologists found the optic nerve dark and dry. Upon checking the other eye the optic nerve is in the same condition. The prognoses is he will be totally blind in about a month. The little sight he has left cannot be improved in any way.

The piece they are attempting to remove will hopefully relieve pressure to the brainstem as well as provide a sample for further testing. The Jansen's are wonderful Christians. They serve God in many ways through their church and community. I know their faith in God is strong, but they need our prayers. I will keep you posted for Jacob's health.

Father John wrote: Thank you to all for prayers during my recent surgery. So far so good! The titanium plate, screws and ceramic disk in my neck has not moved, and that is a great sign of my ability to do nothing! It will take about 9-12 more months for the bone to grow and fuse, I am currently in Physical Therapy and under strict orders to not lift anything over 15 pounds or push anything up over my head. My doctor is happy with the slow but steady progress. Thanks again for your prayers and support.
