

I want to express my thanks to all members that attended the services for Brother Bert it was another strong show of our council unity.





CLOUDS OF WAR

Our country was just starting to recover from the great depression of the 1930's and early 40's. The Knights worked diligently aiding those less fortunate.

Many organizations opened and supported soup kitchens. Most churches did as much as they could.



This soup kitchen was sponsored by Al Capone.

At the outset of the Depression, Al Capone, the notorious gangster from Chicago, established the first soup kitchen. He started it because he wanted to clean up his shady image. Capone's kitchen served three meals a day to ensure that everyone who had lost a job could get a meal.

All during the late 1920's & 30's the Knights of Columbus worked with then President Coolidge in assisting to stop the persecution of Catholics in Mexico by sending the American ambassador to Mexico to intervene during Cristero rebellion. It was not until more than 90,000 Mexicans had died that Dwight Marrow US Ambassador to Mexico was able to broker a truce between the warring factions.

Religious precaution continued into early 1940's when the newly elected Mexican president agreed to stop hostilities in exchange for the Church's efforts to maintain peace, to non-enforcement of most of the anticlerical provisions, an exception being, which deprived the Church of the speeches,

the right to vote, and the right of free political association.

The postwar years saw a membership boom for the Order in the Philippines. Jesuit Father George J. Willmann envisioned the Knights as the premiere lay society in the Philippines and set about establishing new councils and recruiting new members. He appealed to the Supreme Council in 1947 for permission to establish three new councils there and served as the country's first district deputy. By the time Supreme Knight Luke E. Hart visited Manila in 1955, the Order had expanded to include 50 Filipino councils.

War clouds were gathering over Europe and Asia. The Germans under Hitler were gaining momentum. Tito was successful in Spain and Mussolini in Italy. Hedeki Tojo in Japan was invading China and Mongolia. War was coming, but the USA had its head in the sand thinking we were safe with two big oceans between us and them. Even then the Knights were assisting our government in various ways.



Less than two weeks after war was declared between the United Kingdom, France and Germany, the Canadian Knights establish a welfare program for soldiers comparable to the KC huts program that operated during World War I. Within a year, Canadian Knights raise nearly \$250,000 to support troops.

Greetings, my Brother Knights!

I want to drive home a point today.

Back in 1973, a momentous lie was delivered to the American public by the Supreme Court of the United States.

The headline that shook all of America to its roots. "OAHU BOMBED, WAR WITH JAPAN" In doing so, so did the Knights. Unknown to many, the Knights of Columbus like many other organization during this prewar time as it was referred to were working hard to help prepare the USA in its time on need. Now was the time to come together as a nation and work for one cause. "Freedom"

When the U.S. enters World War II, the Order's outreach to soldiers was conducted by the National Catholic Community Service organization. The NCCS models many of its programs on the Order's successful WWI efforts.



As we covered early on in this series when we learned of the Committee on War Activities- Knights of Columbus (In 1940

renamed National Catholic Community Service) during World War 1 started the Casey's Clubhouses throughout the US & Europe. President Roosevelt asked Mary Ingraham to develop a USO modeled after these Casey's of WW1. This request brought together six civilian organizations: the Salvation Army, Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA), Young Women's Christian Association (YWCA), National Catholic Community Service, National Travelers Aid Association and the National Jewish Welfare Board. They were brought together under one umbrella to support U.S. troops

By the time Pearl Harbor was attacked and the United States entered World War II in 1941, a K of C welfare program for servicemen had been well established by Canadian Knights. In the United States, the Order's outreach to soldiers was conducted through the National Catholic Community Service organization, which itself modeled many of its programs on the Knights' war efforts.

All during the war several K of C councils ran or supported and at times organized blood drives under the direction of



the American Red Cross.

Supreme Knight Francis Matthews was chairman of the Executive Committee of the National Catholic Community Service and its representative on the USO board of directors. Materials relating to the Knights of Columbus Peace Program in the United States, the Order's outreach to soldiers was conducted through the National Catholic Community Service organization.

Towards the end of World War II the Supreme Convention in 1944, the Order established a \$1 million trust fund for the children of members who died or became disabled in World War II, years before the Veterans Administration had started any such assistance for dependents. Following the end of the war in 1945, the Order turned its attention to the growing threats of communism and fascism. To combat these dangers, the Knights pasted initiatives to authorize funding for full-page advertisements in 12 major U.S. newspapers and five Canadian papers highlighting the dangers of communism. The ad offered a free copy of Msgr. Fulton J. Sheen's pamphlet, "Communism, the Opium of the People". In 1946 The Knights also launched the Crusade for the Preservation and Promotion of American Ideals. which published books and pamphlets to educate the public on "The perils of communism." Educational pamphlets on communism and the dangers of secularism were published and distributed. By August 1948, there are more than 1,300 K of C discussion groups. Several hundred radio stations broadcasted K of C sponsored programs with the titles "Safeguards of America" and "Foundations of Our American Ideals."

The break is because the radiation keeps working like 4 weeks. He will have an MRI, blood and other tests done mid-January then we see the Dr. the end of January to see the results. Then we will know what's next, by how much of the tumor is left. Prayerfully it will be small enough, (or gone), for chemo alone, if not we may be looking at a surgery. For now we are just going to have a wonderful Christmas, celebrating God's love gift to the world.

Father John wrote: Thank You to all for your Healing Prayers. The projected time to heal from my surgery is 12 – 18 months. I am 6 months into the healing process and pain free. But as you can see that I have a long way to go. As long as I move slow, and do not lift anything heavy I am fine-Rays are taken every 3 months. The bones in my neck are slowly fusing together.

Meanwhile, the postwar years saw a membership boom for the Order in the Philippines. Jesuit Father George J. Willmann envisioned the Knights as the premiere lay society in the Philippines and set about establishing new councils and recruiting new members. He appealed to the Supreme Council for

permission to establish three new councils there and served as the country's first district deputy. By the time Supreme Knight Luke E. Hart visited Manila in 1955, the Order had expanded to include 50 Filipino councils.

In one of the most famous orations of the Cold War period, former British Prime Minister Winston Churchill condemned the Soviet Union's policies in Europe and declares, "From Stettin in the Baltic to Trieste in the Adriatic, an iron curtain has descended across the continent." His speech was considered one of the opening volleys announcing the beginning of the Cold War.

Now we have an Iron Curtin. On the east side the democratic way of thinking and on the west communism/socialism.

The peace was short lived as we now entered into a COLD WAR.




