

Surgery was scheduled for 8 hours to correct a previous surgery which did not heal properly. They will go in thru the front and then roll him over and go in thru the back to make the necessary corrections.

Brother Jack Rock wrote: "My nephew 53 yrs. old died heart attack need prayers. Please keep him and his family in your prayers."

Brother Ron Novello Wrote, "Please keep Nina in your prayers: Nina had a successful neck fusion 2 months ago which relieved some of her pain. She still suffers back pain and continues to need a cane. She will be having a back fusion after the holidays to relieve her lower back pain.

Brother Bob DePaola requested prayers for his grandson Scott, who is seriously ill, his Mother Dana wrote, "The doctors at The Mayo Clinic went over all the lab tests and x-rays. The consensus is they are going to continue treating him with MS meds. Also, the surgery behind the left eye was a failure. He is now totally blind in that eye now and has only one eight in his sight in his right eye. He will more than likely be totally blind in about a month. Brother Bob also requests prayers for his wife Rita. She was in the emergency room with chest pains and a rapid heartbeat. After 7 ½ hours of extensive observation they determined it was pancreatitis. She is on new medications that makes her sleepy.

They signed his head mask, gave him a certificate of completion, and gave him a card with a gift card inside.

We are happy and blessed that the timing worked out to give us a Christmas off for treatments and stuff. Although it is still an urgent matter as we were recently told that it is stage 4. The break is because the radiation keeps working like 4 weeks. He will have an MRI, blood and other tests done mid-January then we see the Dr. the end of January to see the results. Then we will know what's next, by how much of the tumor is left. Prayerfully it will be small enough, (or gone), for chemo alone, if not we may be looking at a surgery. For now we are just going to have a wonderful Christmas, celebrating God's love gift to the world.

Father John wrote: Thank You to all for your Healing Prayers. The projected time to heal from my surgery is 12 – 18 months. I am 6 months into the healing process and pain free. But as you can see that I have a long way to go. As long as I move slow, and do not lift anything heavy I am fine-Rays are taken every 3 months. The bones in my neck are slowly fusing together.

Jack Abajian wrote, "I would like to thank you all my Brothers and families for all your continued Prayers for me and my family. It was great seeing some of our Brothers and wife's today at Church. It was a Blessing; I would truly appreciate your continuous Prayers for me and my family - Father (Michel), my sister (Marie). Please keep Toni (my lovely lady) in your Prayers as well.

PGK Brother Maurice McCaughn's wife Laverne had successful lung surgery, the Docs said they got it all, she is resting at home. She needs our prayers.

Her vertebrae are fractured from osteoporosis and a previous fall at work. Her body leans to one side and she is in constant pain. She is walking with a cane. This is a major surgery, lasting 5 hours, to install a rod down her spinal column and install hardware to the rod from her vertebrae. The surgeon will do incisions on her side and lower back. She will spend 3 or 4 days in the hospital followed by 2 weeks in a rehab facility and will need about 3 or 4 months to recover. The surgeon is confident of the outcome and Nina is her usual upbeat self. Please keep her in your prayers.

Please include all these in your prayers. We wish all of our members a speedy recovery and a healthy year. If I have missed anyone, please give me a call and let me know how you are doing or if you have any planned surgeries.

# FIRST RESPONDERS

Have you ever given any thought to just what a first responder is? You know the person who will run into a burning building as you are running away or the person who will stand and shield you with their body as someone tries to shoot you?

Today February 28, is the 20th anniversary of the North Hollywood shootout. The day began as just another gorgeous Southern California day. Then, shortly after 9 a.m., a spectral scene of combat shooting popped onto TV screens across the southland. A bank robbery caught in the act.

First on the scene was LA Officer James Zboravan with just two months out of the police academy when he faced a barrage of machine-gun fire, shot and wounded by a bank robber he dove across to an unarmored officers to shield them with his bulletproof vest. He was armed with a 9MM semi-automatic pistol. No match for what he was facing. He was shot four times before leaping through a glass doorway.



Two men armed with fully automatic weapons and clad in heavy body armor did more than just rob the Bank of America in North Hollywood that day, they were out to kill police officers and anyone else who got in there way.

For almost an hour, the neighborhood was under siege as they marched through, spraying stores, homes and cars with armor-piercing bullets. Shooting indiscriminately they wounding 11 police officers and six bystanders. The officers dodging bullets

Taking shelter behind their vehicles. Unfortunately the vehicle held no protection as they were



peppered by the hail of bullets that went right through the vehicles. The officers returning

hundreds of shots that were bouncing off harmlessly the bank robbers armored bodies.

More than 300 outgunned and poorly armed law enforcement officers from five agencies, fighting for their lives, fired back. But most were using .38 revolvers or 9 mm pistols pitted against an arsenal of military style high-capacity AK-47s and automatic rifles. Two lucky shots ended the escapade.

Some officers were able to find a gun store that gave out to the officers weapons comparably in size to them. No one asked the store owner to assist he gave as the need arose. Even with these high powered rifles the bullets still just bounced off the bank robbers.

Some officers and civilians bleeding so badly they were sure to bleed to death. An armored truck was commandeered to drive though the area to rescue the fallen. To the officers on the scene time seemed to stand still. A lucky shot by one officer's shotgun hit home in the assailant's back. Eight of the .38 caliber pellets bounced off harmlessly. One found its mark and hit him in the lower spine. This only seeded to make him madder. It was determined later both were high on drugs.



It only ended as you could hope with both assailant's died at the scene.

No law in the land will ever stop a criminal from obtaining illegal weapons. The only deterrent is an armed private citizen. Remember criminals do not obey the law. That is why they are the bad guys.




