The Exemplification of the Fourth Degree will be on Saturday, September 30 in Torrance, CA. The Fourth Degree is the highest degree in our order and the exemplification into the degree is only held once per year.

Any candidates wishing to make their Fourth Degree should contact Paul Helterline (information below) and plan on attending the per-exemplification meeting at St Martins de Pores on Saturday, September 9th at 9:00 AM. This meeting is for all those planning to attend or just want more information.

New Fourth Degree Information

There have been some changes to the uniform recently:

Tuxedo is not required for the September 30th exemplification. Candidates and sideliners may wear a black, navy blue or dark grey business suit, dark tie, plain white shirt (NO button down collar or French cuffs) and plain black shoes. No sport coat. Tuxedo may be worn but not a requirement. Sideliners may wear tuxedo with baldric or dark suit.

Religious and members of the armed services (Including Police & Fire personnel) may wear their clerical garb or dress uniform respectively. NO lapel pins and jewel of office to be worn during exemplification by candidates. You must have your Third Degree membership card with you for the Fourth Degree Exemplification.

Any Third Degree member in good standing is eligible for membership in the Fourth Degree.

THE GARAGE SALE

This year conference rooms 3, 4, 5 and 6 were devoted to The Garage Sale and the first phase was setting up room 4 for the onslaught of goodies that would be dropped off by our parishioners, then moved into room 4 by volunteers, cleaned and priced by volunteers, boxed up by volunteers, and moved to rooms 5 & 6 by volunteers.

The second phase has affectionately become known as "Move Day". On the day before the garage sale, all the goodies collected now in boxes in rooms 5 & 6 along with two storage containers and at least another container amount left outside are then moved to the east side parking lot and put into sections for sale the next day. 107 tables are rented and delivered to display our wares.

The third phase is The Garage Sale itself on Friday, which starts at 7am and goes to 7pm that evening. On Saturday it starts all over again at 7am and goes to 11am. At 11am we start the process of clearing the parking lot which must be done well before the 5pm mass that evening.

This process started on July 12 and ran through The Garage Sale on Saturday, August 5. By 1:30pm on the 5th, everything left over from the garage sale had been put into trucks and taken to Patriots and Paws in Orange (one of our council's military focused charities). Everything else the Yorba Linda High School Aquatic Team picked up and removed for their garage sale in September.

The core team of Mark Thornberg, Paul Helterline, John Lawson, Henry Garrido, Dwight and Kim Oylear and myself wish to thank all those who volunteered to help. Your time and energy is much appreciated.

Many wives of Knights helped and many parishioners joined in because they felt drawn to the fun we had at this important event for our parish.

Also thank you to the Fiesta committee, headed up by Tina Zlaket and Sheila Teevens along with their children, for providing the volunteer's food and snacks for move day and the two days of The Garage Sale. They were fantastic in providing us the fuel to keep on going. Their youngsters rolled around carts with chilled water and cold watermelon as a much needed break from the heat. We volunteers were touched by the kindness shown us by the Fiesta committee.

The following pictures depict the above processes and the volunteers that made it happen at the 2017 Garage Sale. The fellowship, laughs, grunts, sweat, and smiles are truly priceless. These are great memories for the volunteers that worked so diligently.





Brother Knights;

Please keep the following knights and their families in your thoughts and prayers. Please email or call Brother Tony DePaola for any updates.

Please keep Bob Waligore in your prayers. Bob has congestive heart failure. Bob had to call the Paramedics to his home a few nights ago as he could not breath and needed oxygen. The paramedics gave Bob about 8 minutes' worth of oxygen and that helped Bob to breathe better for about 4 hours and then he had a hard time breathing again. They wanted to take him to the hospital but Bob refused, no more hospital for him. As of the last report his doctor has ordered Home Hospice for him. His heart beat is slowing. He does not have anything hooked up to him. He is very responsive to visitors and would like to have more visitors.

Brother Ron Novello wrote: Nina is slowly gaining her strength back and is undergoing physical therapy at home. We met with the oncologist and a cancer surgeon this week and cat scans and blood work were ordered. The cat scans did not show any cancer at this time but there could be some in the area close to where the gall bladder was or in her ducts leading to the stomach. She may need exploratory surgery to be definitive. However, she needs to get well before that is even considered. The surgeon said it was a fortunate accident that the cancer was found as gall bladder cancer usually goes undetected until it's too late to cure. Her legs are

swollen and the surgeon ordered an ultra sound which determined she has a blood clot in her left calf and one in her right groin. She is now on a blood thinner to treat the clots. Overall, we are optimistic about her health and look forward to her full recovery in a few months. She welcomes visits from her family and friends and is very positive about everything. She enjoyed going to a restaurant on Easter for lunch. Please continue to keep her in your prayers.

Leslie Grayson wrote of her husband brother George: George became very ill, as he had an infection. He was essentially unable to move for 10 days. Thankfully, I had started Hospice about a week prior to this. He has recovered, but has lost ground. His ALS is progressing (that is, getting worse.) I know that so many people pray for George, and for me, so I've never asked for prayers. I had Fr. John come out to anoint George with the sacrament of the sick, and he asked if I wanted prayers for George. While George is doing much better, the truth is he could easily become very ill again. He has two terminal neurodegenerative diseases; Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS) and Frontal Temporal Degeneration (FTD). I am so grateful to God for all the blessings in our lives, which include our faith community of which his brother knights are a big part. Thanks for reaching out Tony.

Father John visited Rosalind Tegler at Kindred Hospital Santa Ana, 1901 College Ave, Santa Ana, CA 92706 Bed 14 A

She is still on a ventilator, not able to speak, but is very alert and to communicate with hand gestures, lip reading and her eyes.

I just spoke to Sandra Brewster. It seems Mark who was waiting for a date for his knee surgery has finally had the surgery to remove a very painful cyst from behind his right knee. During the surgery, the doctors went into the front of the knee as well and cleaned out some torn meniscus and other particles from the knee joint which was causing him pain. So now Mark has had his left knee replaced and his right knee worked on as well. He is at home resting.

THE UNKNOWN STORY OF 9/11

Dateline: September 9, 2011

Much has been written and said about September 11, 2001, on the occasion of its 10th anniversary, but one story much less known is the one about the band of boats that came together to rescue nearly 500,000 New Yorkers from the World Trade Center site on the day the towers collapsed.



It was the largest boatlift ever to have happened – greater than the one at Dunkirk during World War II. Yet somehow a story of such large scale became lost in all the rubble. But a new 10-minute documentary called *Boatlift* by Eddie Rosenstein captures the boat evacuations that happened on 9/11. The film is part of four new short documentaries that were created for the 9/11 Tenth Anniversary Summit in Washington, D.C.

"Boats, usually an afterthought in most New Yorkers minds, were, for the first time in over a century, the only way in or out of lower Manhattan," says Tom Hanks, the narrator of the film.

New Yorkers don't really think of Manhattan as an island since everything from the basics to beyond your wildest imagination is so accessible — not typically a feature associated with island life. But on September 11, 2001, those trapped below the World Trade Center site who could not escape without swimming or being rescued by a boat were acutely reminded of that fact.

"People were actually jumping into the river and swimming out of Manhattan. Boats were very nearly running them over," says NY Waterway Captain Rick Thornton in the film.

The captains and crew of the fleet of boats who rescued so many on 9/11 came together with no idea what they would be getting into and no idea whether Manhattan would be attacked again let alone their very own boats. All they knew were that desperate people were in need of help and they couldn't turn their backs on them, even if that meant putting their own lives at risk.

"If it floated, and it could get there, it got there," engineer of the *Mary Gellatly* Robin Jones recalls.



"I never want to say the word 'I should have'," says Vincent Ardolino, captain of the *Amberjack V.* "I tell my children the same thing, never go through life saying you should have. If you want to do something, you do it."

The New York Waterway, the Coast Guard, ferries, tug boats, private boats, party boats, small professional diving boats, and more ferried hundreds of thousands of people to Staten Island, Brooklyn, upper Manhattan, the Bronx and Queens in less than nine hours. Their crews are typical (in every best sense of the word) New Yorkers and ordinary civilians who came together after a distress call came in from the U.S. Coast Guard in New York.

"I've never seen so many tug boats all at once," captain of the Staten Island Ferry James Parese says. "I worked on the water for 28 years, I've never seen that many boats come together at one time that fast. One radio call and they just all came together," Jones said.

Perhaps one of the most amazing aspects of this mass-scale operation was that were no evacuation plans for such a rescue. "You couldn't have planned nothing to happen that fast that quick," Jones said.


It was the ethic code of the seas that made the boat rescues such a success. If a boat needed refueling, another one would pull up alongside it and give it 10,000 gallons of fuel with no questions asked or no one asking for payment. If a woman in a wheelchair needed to be lifted over the fence on the water's edge to get into one of the boats, there were more than enough hands to help lift her. If people were stranded on a ledge by the water, they would get picked up by a boat. No one was left behind.

One of the arresting images in the film was of a massive throng of people pressed up against and even hanging over the rails along the water waving their hands, hoping someone would come to their rescue. They were at land's end in downtown Manhattan, no easy place to conduct any sort of boat

rescue since there aren't many docking places or spots to put a boat ramp.

It was a day that lots of local, ordinary people become heroes. It was a day that was supposed to tear America apart, but instead brought Americans together. It was a day that brought out the best in many people.

"We wanted to tell a story that reminds Americans that this is a country that bounces back from adversity," the President of the Center for National Policy Stephen Flynn, who had been a U.S. Coast Guard officer, told me. "Our national DNA is resilience. The key for us is to move forward with some key lessons and one of the lessons missing is the strength of civil society and how it responded when 9/11 happened."
